Interview

This week we interviewed *Devilbadger101*, a Board of Directors staff member at Air Ollie.

What is your role as a member on the Board of Directors?

My role of Board of Directors is to help other staff members in their roles either with advice or helping them in general. I also take a moderate amount of control over decisions but that is only a small part. I also then host flights and try to make the realism realistic as possible with adding certain stuff to airports or just thinking of ideas in general.

How long have you been on the Board of Directors?

Hard to say really, I haven't counted it but I'd guess 5-6 months. However, I've been with the airline for a very long time since I worked from being a LR as ground crew which then I changed to FO. Then slowly got promoted over time.

What sort of challenges would you face as a member on the Board of Directors?

Challenges would be like people trying to bring down the airline because they have been fired or banned from the airline for reasons and then because they think they are right deciding to ruin the airline because they think they have done nothing wrong in the first place. Other challenges can be when stuff isn't working during the flight so you have to try and fix it at the same time of trying to do the job you have been assigned in game.

How would you solve such challenges?

To solve such challenges, we would either try to find a temporary fix or for the people trying to ruin the airline either show them no attention at all so they get no attention at all meaning they would realize it isn't doing anything and then they would stop.; -What do you think of the future of Air Ollie? I think the future is bright for Air Ollie with the new developers and then along with the new HR's which have been hired bring a whole new load of potential to the airline. We had over 42 applications for HR so I can't wait for what's going to happen with LR applications. This will then also bring even more potential.

What are the pros and cons of Air Ollie?

We also development everything ourselves, so we are original. The cons probably are how big we are. We don't get full servers at flights, which is annoying, but at the same time it's good because we don't have to deal with lots players.

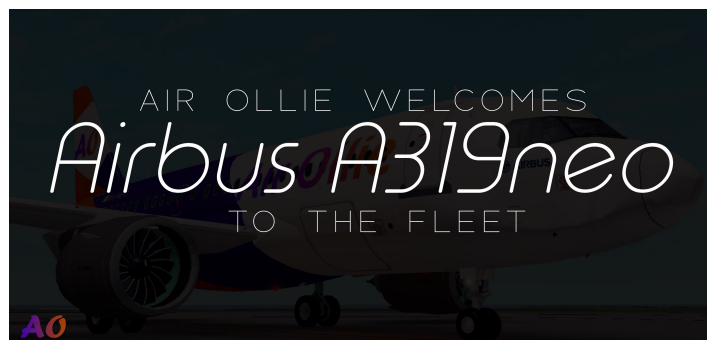
