Bombardier Q100

On the 25th of May we released the smallest plane ever to enter the Air Ollie fleet. The Bombardier Q100 featuring only 12 passenger seats. Her inaugural flight was operating the return flight from Humberside to Vestmannaeyjar. This was a test flight to see if it could adapt to the situations we put it in. The feedback we got from passengers and staff was incredible. On the inaugural it performed 2 circles and a low fly-by of the town of Vestmannaeyjar before making a smooth touchdown on Vestmannaeyjar's runway. This aircraft will mainly operate on the Grímsey island hop flights which will be launching in the coming weeks. It features the slogan "Come Explore Iceland!" on the side of the engine to promote the discovery of the beautiful country that is Iceland. We at Air Ollie feel like we excel in this area bringing Iceland to the comfort of your home. We are sure this aircraft will have a very bright future with Air Ollie!



Interview

This week we interviewed Atomibird. Atomibird is Head of Departments Cabin Crew & Airport Staff at Air Ollie.

What is your role as Head of Department?

My role is pretty simple. I have to manage everything in the Cabin Crew/Airport Staff department. Trainings, meetings and things like that. Of course, being a HoD (Head of Department) means that you have to take responsibility for everything that happens.

What is the role of your department?

Well, we have to deliver week in and week out. Without Cabin Crew/Airport Staff there won't be so much success at flights. We have to serve passengers. It is hard job because whole flight depends on you. Sometimes it can be tough but you have to never give up.

What sort of challenges would a HoD Cabin Crew face? How would you deal with these challenges?

There is a lot. Every day brings new issues. You never know what will happen in an hour. You have to predict who will be the best for this job. You have to make sure everyone knows what they are doing. It is hard to make everything on 100%. I always say to my staff that they have to work on 150% because 100% is not enough. Only the ones that can take it will manage to hold on to their jobs. Luckily every staff member at the Cabin Crew department is ready to give everything. I have a lot of experience in this industry but I must say I never saw something like this department. It is joy to work at Air Ollie.

What trainings would your staff undergo to become Cabin Crew? Is it an extensive training?

Trainings can be hard. My job is to make sure new staff can take the pressure. Let me brief you about the training procedure. We start at the lounge of the airport, then we move on to customer service, then we will go to plane and train trainees for the hardest part of their job, serving passengers. After that your training is done. It can be hard sometimes but our job is about that.

How long have you been Head of Department?

For 2 or 3 months now. I don't really know, time flies but I must say I am happy that I already managed to make some of my dreams come true.

Do you enjoy your job as HoD at Air Ollie?

It can be tough. It can be stressful. But being HoD at Air Ollie is one of the best jobs you can have. My staff members are one of the best and I think they have a very long career ahead of them.

How would you deal with misconducted staff?

Unfortunately I have had to deal with misconducted staff members already. I don't really like to warn or fire staff members but sometimes you have to. People are angry at you because they were doing great (in their eyes) but the reality is that they are not that great. Our job is hard. If you can't take it you have to go.

Do you think the future of your department is bright?

As it stands the future of the Air Ollie Cabin Crew department is very bright. I must say I already found staff members I was looking for. Of course I hope a lot of people will apply for Cabin Crew in the future.

As I said this job can be hard but if you work hard you can achieve everything. When I got this job my first thoughts were if I will make it, will I be able to manage everything. The key to success is to work hard. If you work hard you will get what you want. I can promise that we are working very hard every day to make sure that our passengers feel great.

Because this was the last question I would like to add something. After you read this interview you may think "He says he is good but why does he not work for top airlines", I never wanted to work in airlines like Lemonde. They are too big. Most of your dreams would not be achievable. So if you want to be one of the best you have to start at small airlines. I am happy that I can work at Air Ollie.
